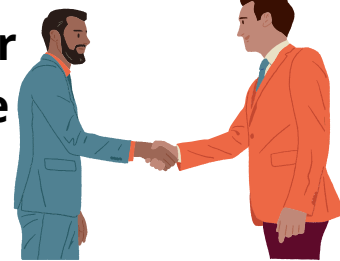

PEI Community Navigators Deliver English Language Training for Workplace Safety

Since its foundation, the PEI Community Navigators program has provided free general English conversation circles in the Eastern, Central, and Western regions of PEI. This very special class focusing on language for safety developed recently when Thane Smallwood of the PEI Bag Company contacted the central Navigators, Marla and Kristi, to discuss available language support for their employees.

Newcomers bring many talents to our beautiful Island. These employees are highly skilled workers and are eager to learn the language skills necessary to help them excel, including the often high demand area of safety language. This innovative class sought to bridge an existing gap by providing the basics of safety language, ensuring employees can apply their expertise in the most effective way possible. In searching for a teacher, Marla and Kristi welcomed Maggie, who has an extensive background in teaching English as a Second Language, and who always makes class an interesting and friendly place to learn. The course is three months in length for two hours weekly, currently delivered to 12 students in the William Callbeck Centre in Central Bedeque.

Since their initial meeting, the PEI Community Navigators and the PEI Bag Company have worked closely to ensure participants are getting comprehensive support. We will soon start a second round of the course that all are welcome to join, and we can't wait to see what other ideas grow from our partnerships with businesses across the Island!
